Introduction

Students Achievement and Major Activities Conducted by SNA.

1. On 19th April 2025, Mr. Sujal Joshi represented College at Spandan State-level Rangoli Competition conducted by Maharashtra University Of Health Sciences and secured 2nd Prize in it.



2. On 6th May 2025, Mr. Sujal Joshi & Mr. Tushar Khillare represented college at TNAI Elocution Competition, in which Mr. Sujal Joshi secured 3rd prize in English Medium and Mr. Tushar Khillare secured 2nd prize in Hindi medium .

3. Independence Day Celebration (15th August 2025)

The SNA Department of K. J. Somaiya School and College of Nursing organized the 77th Independence Day Celebration on 15th August 2025 from 7:00 am to 7:45 am at K. J. Somaiya Hospital Campus. The event was conducted in collaboration with SNA & NSS units of the Nursing College, along with K. J. Somaiya Medical College and Physiotherapy College.

The program commenced with a security parade followed by flag hoisting by Dr. Mitali Nayak (Dean, Medical College), Dr. Shweta Manwadkar (Principal, Physiotherapy College), and Dr. Avani Oke (Principal, Nursing College).
